Dear Sir:-

In accordance with your request, we would state in regard to the time of the commencement of work on the Hyde Park Station for the N. Y. N. H. & H. R.R. Co., that it is our intention at the present time to start work on this building on December 26, 1912, and the work will go forward as rapidly as is consistent with the season and the difficulties which will probably have to be met in putting up a structure of this kind.

The work is such that at first it will have to go slowly as the station being located above the railroad tracks makes it necessary to work a smaller force of men than would otherwise be feasible.

However, it will probably be completed during the coming Summer so that by another Winter it will be ready for occupancy.
