
New Railroad Station Opened Monday Morning

The new Hyde Park railroad station was opened for business at six o'clock Monday morning of this week. The main entrance to the building, which is constructed of steel and stucco with tiled roof and ornamental trimmings, is located at the corner of River and Business streets. There is also a large waiting room on the lower level for inward bound trains and a baggage room on the outward bound side, both of these buildings similar in construction to the larger station.

The new building is one of the finest and most modern along the New Haven road. It is finished in cement and marble with aluminum filled woodwork. As all trains stopping at Hyde Park are to run on the outside tracks, the inner ones being reserved for express trains, passengers can remain in the upper waiting room and see the approaching train in ample time to descend to the lower level. As the new station forms a bridge spanning the tracks it relieves what has been a long continued inconvenience by enabling passengers to cross from one side to the other while sheltered, during the inclement weather.
